About the Committee

Women have played an influential and outsized role in every one of our nation's anniversary celebrations since 1876. From building a one-of-a-kind Women's Pavilion showcasing women's inventions and innovations at the Centennial World's Fair, to restoring Strawberry Mansion in 1926 and Laurel Hill Mansion in 1976, women have used their leadership and capital to create a legacy of action and impact.

Building on this tradition, the Women's Committee for the 250th harnesses the social, intellectual and economic power of women to support transformational legacy projects that elevate the contributions of Philadelphia women to Philadelphia and American history. These efforts underscore the importance of women's leadership, the power of individual and collective action, and Philadelphia's role in the past, present and future of U.S. democracy.

The Committee is a program of PHILADELPHIA250 and the Philadelphia Visitor Center, whose goal is to help Philadelphia realize its vision of a celebration that reaches all communities, inspiring civic pride and action and sharing the economic and cultural impacts of 2026 across all neighborhoods.

Legacy Projects

- **Women's Pitch Competition:** Recognizing that financial independence is critical to exercising one's fundamental rights, the Committee is providing a grant of \$75,000 to the Women's Opportunities Resource Center (WORC). The funds will support a competitive citywide pitch competition that equips participants with a powerful pitch deck and direct access to opportunities and resources. Finalists receive cash awards and additional business support.
- **Historic Belmont Mansion and Underground Railroad Museum:** Inspired by the story of the American Women's Heritage Society, the Women's Committee will raise funds and awareness to help restore Belmont Mansion, a weekend retreat for the Founding Fathers in the colonial era. Saved from demolition in 1986 by Audrey Thornton, over the past 40 years three generations of African-American women have preserved the site and shared its history as a stop on the Underground Railroad.
